Innovative Clinical Application Award

PURPOSE

The Innovative Clinical Application Award recognizes and honors developers or vendors who have successfully developed and implemented a clinical nursing application that assists nurses in the delivery of quality nursing care.

CRITERIA

The goal should be to improve health care by using nursing clinical data. The main criteria are uniqueness and originality in the application. Some examples of items that the application might address are listed below, but the criteria are not bound to these.

- · Creates ease of documentation
- Includes and permanently records activities that are an integral part of nursing care such as patient teaching, assessment, nursing diagnoses, interventions and outcomes
- Expedites the retrieval of results of tests, physician's orders, etc., for patients
- Makes available data needed by the nurse and the agency for decision making in providing nursing care including, but not limited to:
 - Individual patient records
 - Data in the aggregate to provide clinical data for administrative reporting and other data needs
 - Current literature accessibility
- Includes participation of nurses in the design, testing and evaluation phases of both the data structure and interface development
- · Has security to protect patient privacy and confidentiality
- Is ergonomically sound
 - o Interface is easy to use and data is represented in a clear manner
 - o Physical placement of hardware is based on ergonomic principles
- Is capable of providing nursing care information to regulatory and other agencies concerned with health care
- Includes all elements of the Nursing Minimum Data Set
- · Represents a new approach to collecting clinical nursing data

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

A complete nomination consists of:

- · Online entry form and payment
- Supporting narrative that addresses criteria (2 pages), including the needs the clinical application meets and demonstration of how this application meets these needs
- Letter of acceptance
- Any supporting software or URL (If program is password protected, password must be included in order to evaluate. If time-limited password, allow for entire judging process through 15 May 2011.)
- Any other supporting material that might include, but is not limited to:
 - Screen shots of the application
 - Articles about the application
 - o Letters of endorsement or references
 - Testimonials from staff nurses, administrators or others
 - Websites that have more information about the application
 - o Items that demonstrate any of the characteristics described
